**Civitan's Children
Fon Smith**

Our support for the Civitan International Research Center last year was invaluable in enabling the Center to develop a major imaging facility with fMRI scanners and the new *McNulty Civitan Scientist* award undoubtedly helped influence Dr. Harald Sontheimer, the 2004 recipient, to accept the offer from The University of Alabama at Birmingham to become the Center's new director. It also appears that our \$100,000 matching challenge grant has stimulated several other Civitan clubs and districts to increase their *Civitans at the Helm* contributions over 2004 levels. We all can very be proud of our contributions to CIRC.

Now we must look ahead. We, the directors of the Foundation, have been asked to consider two new proposals for the coming year.

Dr. Sontheimer and Dr. Alan Percy, the Research Center's medical director, are proposing to develop a major thematic program that will focus on the critical area of research into autism spectrum disorders. This initiative will have a multidisciplinary focus and will take advantage of the Center's close proximity to researchers from other UAB departments to include a broad range of specialists. Studies will involve neurobiologists, geneticists, psychiatrists, pediatricians, psychologists and other disciplines. If we agree to support this new initiative, two new faculty members will be recruited to direct the program. One will be a basic scientist and one will be a clinical researcher. Individuals will be sought who are experienced and are at midpoints in their academic careers.

The second request is for us to continue the \$200,000 McNulty Civitan Scientist Award with some modifications for next year. Drs. Sontheimer and Percy would be designated as Chesapeake Civitan Eminent Scholars with \$30,000 each to support their respective research, with the balance of the grant be used to support two McNulty Civitan Scientists for 2005. The two candidates are:

????? John Bart Hodgens, Ph.D. Dr. Hodgens is a clinical psychologist who is pursuing innovative clinical research into attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD).

????? Lucas Pozzo-Miller, Ph.D. Dr. Pozzo-Miller is a neuroscientist who is directing the study of molecular mechanisms of the communication between nerve cells in the brain.

When we come together in Roanoke on November 18th, I will ask you to make a decision about these two worthy proposals. Copies of these proposals were distributed at our August meeting for your review. Suggestions on Candy Box Operations Opening Up New Accounts

John Markey, Candy Box Chairman

- ? Call on prospective clients during their non-busy times.
- ? Have a candy box filled with candy.
- ? Place box in front of client with candy facing him, so he can see the filled box while you are giving him reasons why he should allow you to place a box with him. You should have at least 4 reasons why he should have a candy or coin box in his business.
 1. Tell him what you do with your money collected.
 2. Show him pictures of your service projects.
 3. Tell him that you encourage all of your members to patronize the places that have candy boxes (plus business for him).
 4. Customers appreciate his community efforts
 5. He doesn't have to worry about having his own charitable box.
 6. Show him pictures of the Research Center (Show 8 ½ by 11 brochure of Research Center as well as "Civitan built this center" brochure.
 7. Tell him of the tremendous progress being made for mental retardation at the center. Let him borrow the Research Center's video.
 8. Invite him to one of your meetings.
- ? Ask him where he wants you to place the box on his counter.
- ? Tell him you will be by to replace the candy and collect the money.
- ? Let him know how much money is being created from his business.
- ? Get the President of your club to send him a letter thanking him for allowing a candy box to be placed in his business.

AND

When Servicing Existing Accounts

- ? Have extra box filled with candy so you can exchange his box with as little inconvenience as possible
- ? Tell owner/manager what your club is using the money for.
- ? Each time thank him/her for allowing you to have a candy box in his place of business.
- ? Put him/her on your club newsletter mailing list.
- ? Send him/her a thank you card periodically.
- ? Invite him/her to your club socials.
- ? Invite him to your club meetings.
- ? Invite him to join your club.

At the end of one year, present him with Certificate of Appreciation (get these from International.

Call Debra Smith) Have certificate framed. Get his picture. Put it in club newsletter. Send him a copy.

After one or two years, present him with a candy box plaque (order from International. Get his picture. Put it in club newsletter. Send him a copy. Better still. Invite him to your regular meeting and present the plaque there. Take his picture. Put in club newsletter.

Make up a list of each box location, publish it in newsletter, along with the person servicing that box.

Encourage members to patronize his business. When there instruct members to thank him for having a candy box there.

Place boxes in restaurants where you pay the bill on the way out.

Place a box where people have to go inside to do business with that merchant. (Dry cleaners, flower shops, car washes, mom and pop grocery stores, funeral homes, transmission shops, barber and beauty shops, etc.) Encourage members to help place boxes in stores where they do business. Owners will allow a candy box if people are doing business with them already.

Some Do's for Candy Boxes

- ? Clean the boxes.
- ? Add Civitan sticker to front of box (From International).
- ? If box is over 10 years old, throw it out and get new boxes from Debra Smith at International.
- ? Throw away old display card. Get new ones from International.
- ? On back of box, list the various organizations that are receiving money or help from your club.
- ? If money from box is less than \$10.00 per month, replace it with a coin box. Don't have to go by so often to replace candy. Club gets to keep 50% of money collected.
- ? Do send your money into International each month.
- ? Be sure and get the money out on a regular basis. Avoid the temptation of someone stealing the box.
- ? Encourage your members to patronize that business. Have them personally thank owner for having a candy box.
- ? Write an article about candy boxes in your local town newspaper. Let public know what you do with the money.

We want to be number one in all of Civitan International. Right now our district is number 2. North Carolina East leads us by \$10,000. All it would take to be number 1 is for each club that is not now in the candy business to place just 10 boxes producing a minimum of \$10 each. Fifteen clubs will generate \$18,000 more than our district is generating now. North Carolina East won't have a chance!

Our district is doing quite well in candy box and coin box collections through August of 2005. Many clubs collections are above last years.

It shows that your candy box chairperson is doing a great job for your club! This means more money for your very worthy service projects.

The top ten clubs in the District in candy and coin boxes are:



This represents almost 76% of all monies collected from our district through the month of August. We still have one month to go before the end of the year. Club Presidents, be sure that your treasurer has turned in all the candy box money and sent a check to International.

Thank you for your hard work in helping increase the collections for the candy and coin boxes for our district. A message to the new incoming club presidents: Have you chosen your candy and coin box chairperson for the coming year? If so, have you set a goal for him or her to achieve? Remember the road to your goal starts with your first step.

My goal is for our district to be number one in candy boxes. The only way this can be achieved is if more clubs decide to get involved in the candy box project. You, the club president, have to make that decision for your club. If you have never done candy boxes before, maybe this is the year to start!

For clubs who are already involved in the district candy box project, you need to take another look at not only the number of boxes you have out, but the amount of money you are collecting per box. In talking with a few clubs at the convention, I was amazed at how hard you work servicing a box that brings you less than \$12 per month, especially with the price of gasoline today. If a box is bringing in less than \$12, you should consider replacing it with a coin box. Not only is it less work but you get to keep more of the money for your service projects.

I would like to thank the Chesapeake District membership for their support of club-building efforts and membership growth plans. There is a NEW SPIRIT of cooperation and determination for growth that will see an increase in membership in the coming year. We must start immediately thinking of club growth and begin "Talking Civitan" in our communities and searching for "others to join in fellowship and service of Civitan".

As part of club building and rebuilding efforts, we will be sending a membership survey to club presidents. This survey will focus on important questions concerning the health of your club. We promise this to be short and give you, the members, and an opportunity to voice your views on club health and growth in general. Your views and thoughts are most important to us as we make plans for growth in our district. Please obtain a copy of this survey from your club president, complete it and send it back to the requested address. A committee, now forming, will review your collective ideas and compile a plan of action that will address these needs. Please do not include your name or address. Thank you for your time and effort in this project. It is greatly appreciated.

Club building and rebuilding are chores best accomplished by TEAMS of dedicated Civitans who are committed to club growth. I suggest we create TEAMS that are: T- Trained in E- Every A-Aspect of M- Membership! Each club should appoint a team of 2-5 people to handle the matters of recruitment. This team would be trained according to Civitan International's Club in A Box standards for new club building. Training would take place on the club level, at the club member's convenience.

Club builder responsibilities would focus on the club builder's talents and interests. Club building can be fun when it involves something you enjoy! Seek nights would then be handled by this team and recruitment would take place by the team trained on Civitan International procedure. These teams would handle Seek meetings, programs, publicity and recruitment prior to the meeting. Also, this team would look for additional avenues to recruit for their club in their communities. Once there is an increase in membership, this team would then become or appoint the club development team that would welcome and retain their new members. This team now has the experience needed to build a new club in a neighboring community. Once a club has obtained Golden Circle Status, it is much easier to spread the word of Civitan by taking on new projects, including the building of a new club.

As the district recruiter, I would be most

concerned with training new club builders to take on the club building and rebuilding responsibilities. A committee would develop a training program whose members were strong in public relations and meeting skills. A strong training program would re-energize clubs and assure them they would have the support needed to develop and implement a growth plan. This should ultimately produce a strong retention and club building team in each club. These TEAMS would ensure the retention of membership for many years to come. *Congratulations to Tyson's, Arlington and Baltimore for already scheduling!*

We must find new members to help us serve our citizenship. Please ASK, ASK, ASK friends, neighbors and co-workers to join you in discovering the difference Civitans can make! Remember your creed and welcome these new guests to Civitan and tell them how much they are needed. Develop new Civitan friendships and watch your club and district grow!
